Executive Summary

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) requires each not-for-profit hospital to conduct a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) every three years to identify significant health needs in the community, to report impact of previous community health improvement initiatives, and to develop an implementation plan to address and measure community health activities created to address the significant health needs.

INTEGRIS Health reports compliance with the requirements on the IRS Form 990 Schedule H annually. INTEGRIS Health created CHNA reports and implementation plan for HPI Community Hospital South, North and Northwest Surgical Hospital. Documents were made available to the public.

INTEGRIS Health collaborated with local community partners on the CHNA. The results identified Access to Education, Access to Meaningful Employment, Access to Healthy Food and Access to Healthcare as the priority issues. HPI Community Hospital South, North and Northwest Surgical chose to focus on Access to Healthy Food, Access to Healthcare and Tobacco as the identified priority issues.

The hospitals have limited resources, not every health indicator which has an identified need for improvement will be directly addressed. Those community needs identified, but not "prioritized" for improvement included the following:

- · Access to Education
- · Access to Meaningful Employment

The issues were chosen based on state and local data, surveys, identifiable gaps, available resources, and input from small focus groups. In 2021, four non-profit hospitals engaged in a joint Community Health Needs Assessment: INTEGRIS Health, Mercy Hospital Oklahoma City, OU Health, and SSM Health St. Anthony. Surveys were collected across Oklahoma County and broken down to identify needs in specific areas.

Community Hospital South, North and Northwest Surgical Hospital has developed a three-year Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) designed to meet the needs of the community based on the results of the CHNA which was completed in January of 2022. The plan aligns with INTEGRIS Health pillars of excellence.

This implementation plan addresses the following priority issues.

- · Access to Care
- · Access to Healthy Food
- · Tobacco

During this plan cycle, INTEGRIS Health will collaborate with community partnerships to improve the health for low-income, underserved, and uninsured populations. INTEGRIS Health is committed to the successful completion of the CHIP, utilizing a collaborative, system wide approach. Outcome measures will be tracked quarterly and annually through the evaluation process.

Community Health Priority Issue: ACCESS TO CARE

Lack of access to affordable and timely medical care was a reverberating theme throughout the assessment process. Access to comprehensive, quality health care services is important. It promotes and maintains good health, prevents and manages diseases, reduces unnecessary disability and premature death, and encourages health equity. Good health also requires oral and mental health care access. Three components of access are insurance coverage, health services, and timeliness of care. Potential barriers include high cost of care, underinsured or uninsured, lack of primary or specialty services, and culturally sensitive care. The uninsured and underinsured populations experience delays in receiving timely care, lack the ability to receive preventive measures, and seek care in the local emergency rooms, which results in preventable hospital admissions. In Oklahoma, it's estimated that 17% of people are without insurance. (1)

Community Health Priority Issue: ACCESS TO HEALTHY FOOD

In Oklahoma, the food environment index (index of factors that contribute to healthy food environment) is 5.8 compared to 7.8 nationwide. (1) Hunger affects people of all walks of life. Community survey results identified access to healthy food as an issue and scored high in both survey forms. Therefore, we will continue to partner with the local food banks and pantries across the system to address hunger and malnutrition in the state.

Community Health Priority Issue: TOBACCO

Although tobacco was not specifically identified by the community as a priority issue, INTEGRIS Health chose to continue addressing the issue. The state of Oklahoma continues to have an "F" in heart disease deaths and a grade of "D" in the incidence of lung cancer. (2) Oklahoma is one of the unhealthiest states in the nation. Each year 7,500 adults die from their own smoking. (3) With the expansion of vaping and electronic cigarettes, nicotine addiction remains an important issue. 31.1% of cancer deaths in Oklahoma can be attributed to smoking. (3) Tobacco use in Oklahoma costs \$1.62 billion in direct health care costs. (3)
